CLOSED FOR THE SEASON!


Regrettably the SID Board have decided not to open the Pavilion building for the season of 2020. Assessment has deemed the existing building will not satisfy Health and Safety requirements for public use. SID takes very seriously its duty of care to the public and volunteers.

We currently have numerous funding applications in for the refurbished building plan and will keep you posted on our progress over the next couple of months. The Playing Fields grounds will be open and available for use by the community as usual for dog walking, regular football matches, bowling competitions, and summer/autumn events.

We would like to take this opportunity to say a 'massive thank you' to all the volunteers who have worked very hard in the Pavilion and on the grounds over the past two years.

SID and the Playing Fields Steering Group are working together and would welcome new volunteers to organise the annual Sports Day which will go ahead on Saturday 25th July, keep the date in your diaries!

We are still having problems with transferring the legal title of the Playing Fields to the Community. Burness Paul solicitors, funded by HIE, have been acting on our behalf with what is a testing legal process. The land has been valued; we aim to acquire the land from The Crown Estates, which has ownership by default, with the help of the Scottish Land Fund.
